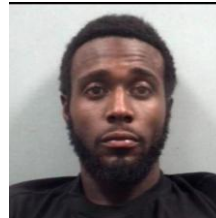

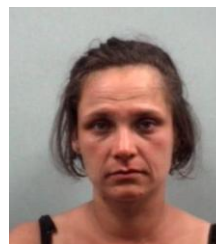

Significant Events



In the early hours of February 3rd, officers were patrolling a local apartment complex. **Norrick Hyman** was observed on the property, where he had previously been trespassed. After a few moments, officers prevailed, and **Hyman** was placed into the car for transport to Cocoa P.D. booking. During the ride, **Hyman** became upset, and started voicing threats upon the officer's safety, earning the charge of **Corruption by Threat**, to be accompanied by the original charges of **Resisting Arrest** and **Trespassing**.

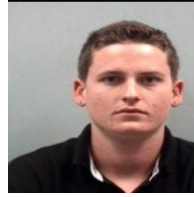

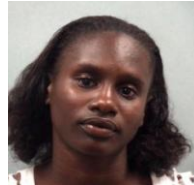
DRUG ARRESTS.....



On January 3rd, officers received information that there may be a stolen truck in the area. With the assistance of the Sheriff's Office helicopter, and several Cocoa units, the truck was located and subjects were seen running from the vehicle. The pilot was tracking the driver from above until officers could navigate to the dense brush in that vicinity. Nicholas Hamblen was confirmed as the driver, and was charged with Auto Theft and Resisting Arrest. Hamblen was booked and taken to Brevard County Jail.

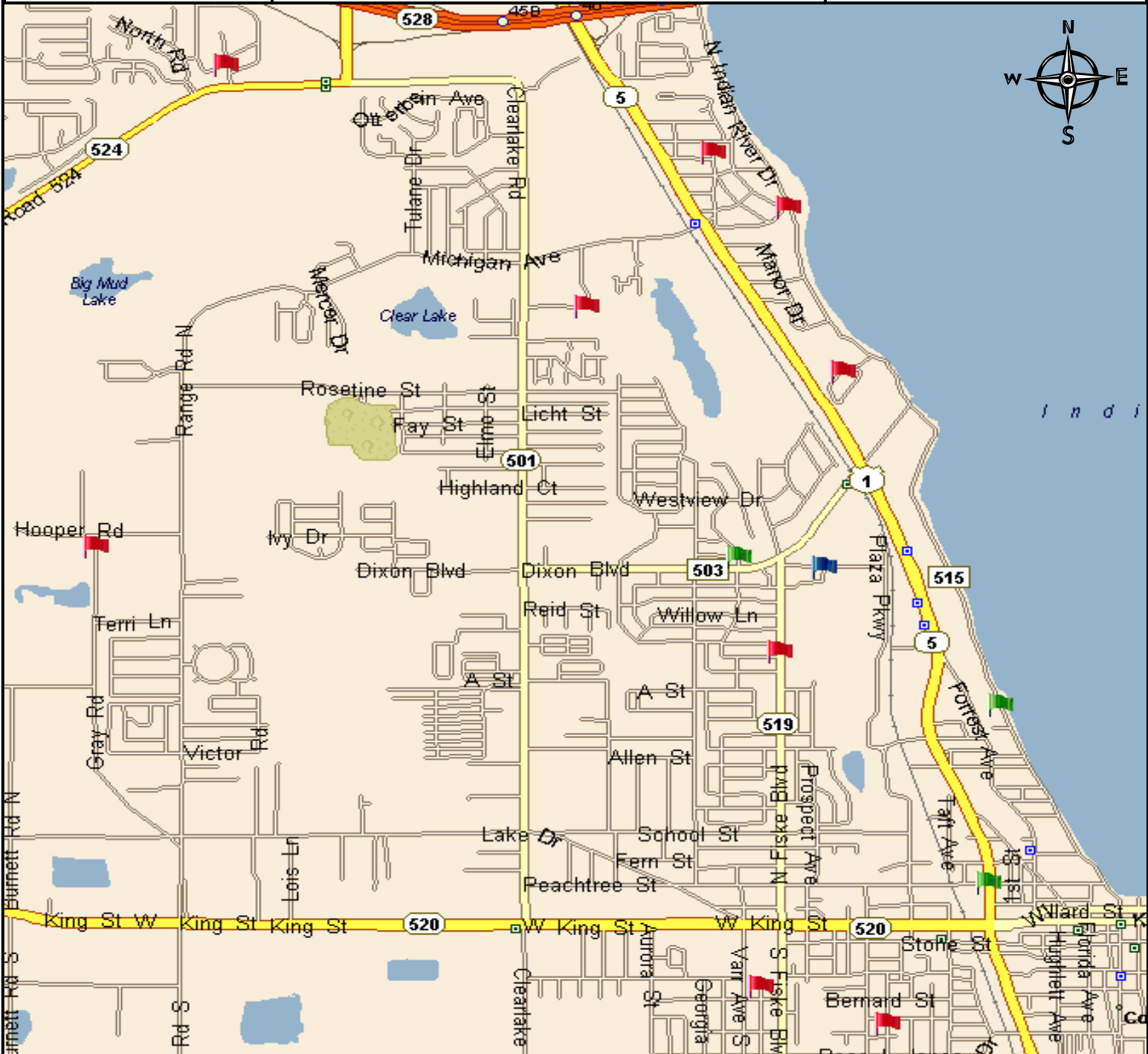

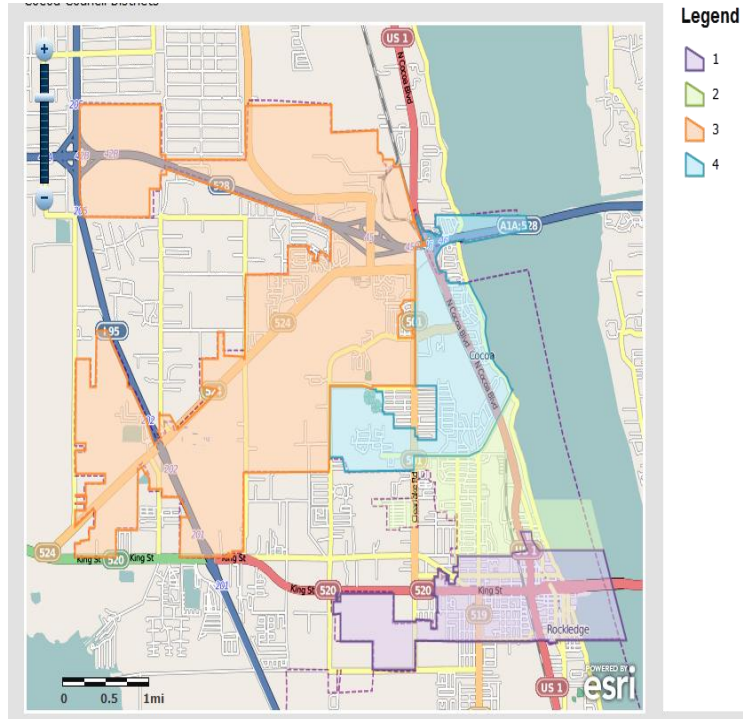
